NACHW integrates the cultural wisdom, professional expertise, lessons and legacy of CHW and ally leaders to address the growing need for CHW leadership and national advocacy.

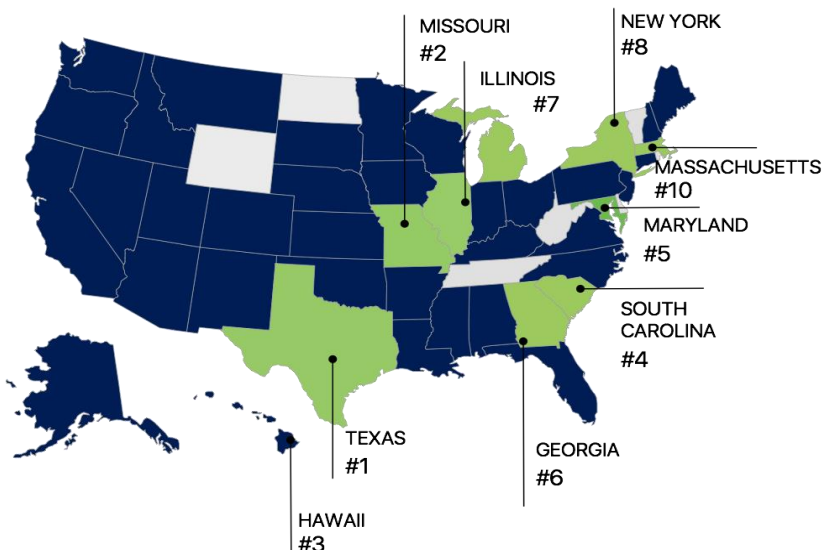
United, we mobilize CHWs and our networks, create professional and leadership development opportunities, build a research and education hub, and develop policy to sustain workforce integrity and impact.

NACHW MEMBERSHIP

Individual CHW Members are frontline public health workers who are trusted members of and/or have an unusually close understanding of the community served. This trusting relationship enables CHWs to serve as a liaison/link/intermediary between health/social services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery.

Individual Ally Members include medical and behavioral health providers, public health professionals, educators, advocates, administrators, researchers, and others who support the CHW workforce but who do not identify as CHWs themselves.

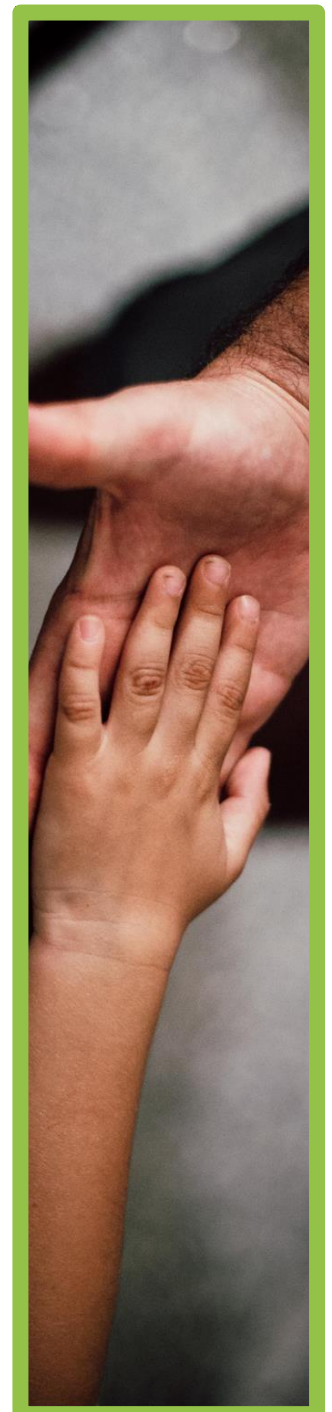
