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Since March 2020, NACHW has been on the frontlines of amplifying the roles, leadership, and capacity of CHWs and their Networks, Associations and Coalitions. We provide leadership and partner with organizations who are committed to achieving racial and health equity during covid response and professional identity, respect, protection, and sustainability for CHWs.

NACHW Co-Founded Initiatives

- The <u>Community-Based Workforce Alliance</u> co-founded with Health Begins, Health Leads, the WHO Community Health Acceleration Project, Partners in Health, Last Mile Health, and others intended to strengthen advocacy, communications, technical assistance, and monitoring.
- The <u>Vaccine Equity Cooperative</u>, co-founded with Health Leads, Partners in Health, Native Ways Federation, and CONVINCE USA, which believes we can thoughtfully and authentically engage communities to acknowledge and address the root causes of vaccine hesitancy and increase vaccine acceptance and access. Five key groups have joined forces to launch a comprehensive, two-year national vaccine equity campaign. The latest achievement of the cooperative was launching a community specific vaccine resource repository for the community-based workforce: https://vaccineequitycooperative.org/.

NACHW Policy Advisories

• NACHW serves on Families USA's <u>Vaccine Equity Advisory Committee</u> which informs their strategic initiative to advocate for and achieve policy changes that: make COVID-19 vaccine distribution more equitable, and build a foundation to address long-standing, structural health inequities.

NACHW COVID Advisories

- NACHW is an advisory partner in <u>Partners in Health's</u> *Reaching Equity through Community Based Vaccination Engagement and Recovery (RECOVER)* an initiative to mobilize the U.S. community health workforce and accelerate vaccine uptake. The following narrative provides a description of how PIH, together with national, regional, and local partners, will address COVID-19 related health disparities and advance health equity. This is a six-month grant funded by Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) Funding Opportunity Number: HRSA-21-136 Community-Based Workforce for COVID-19 Vaccine Outreach.
- 2110 Community Health Workers for COVID Response and Resilient Communities–Evaluation and Technical Assistance (CCR-ETA) (CDC-RFA-DP21-2110) funds will deliver training and technical assistance to CCR recipients to ensure they have the knowledge and skills to support the COVID-19 public health response to manage outbreaks and community spread. - NACHW advises MSM's <u>National COVID-19 Resiliency Network (NCRN)</u>, the initiative offers individuals and families access to new COVID-19 related resources to help reduce the negative impact of the pandemic on communities. The NCRN is created for the community, by the community to ensure the diverse needs of our nation are understood and addressed. NACHW will be advising this project ongoing until June 2022.
- NACHW advises the <u>Rockefeller Foundation-US Equitable Vaccine Impact Strategy</u>, the Rockefeller Foundation announces the launch of a historic \$20 million <u>Equity-First Vaccination Initiative</u> to improve the vaccination rate among communities of color, which have been disproportionately impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic.
